




## The contribution of MGFÜ for the TASK4ISI project

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The Hungarian Economic Development Agency (MGFÜ, PP8), an SME development agency, is responsible for multiple tasks within the Interreg Central Europe TASKS4ISI project. Within the framework of WP1, most of the activities are organized around the management of regional Inclusive and Sustainable Innovation HUBs (ISIHUBs), aimed to enhance business skill development and generate networking opportunities for disadvantaged entrepreneurs (female, young and people with disabilities).

MGFÜ is responsible for the daily management of Work Package 1 (WP1) through the full lifecycle of the TASK4ISI project implementation.

First, with the support of the TASK4ISI consortium, MGFÜ has defined and prepared a project document (D.1.1.1.) that set the general rules for responsible partners on how to operate regional ISIHUBs during project implementation. The document also established a timeframe on the frequency of face-to-face/online ISIHUB meetings.

During the first Hungarian regional ISIHUB meeting in 2024, the scope of the project and the goal of ISIHUB was presented for stakeholders, experts and target groups, and some best practices for female, young and people with disabilities were also shared and discussed by the participants.

In the second ISIHUB meeting, held in February 2025, MGFÜ presented a concept for developing business and networking skill development learning content for the described target groups and collected valuable information from the invited stakeholders.

As the responsible partner for regional ISIHUB management in Hungary, MGFÜ is also expected to continuously participate in the TNISIHUB meetings, the umbrella level of ISIHUBs in supporting transnational cooperation, and make presentation about the progress of its ISIHUB.

In addition, MGFÜ took part in organizing an on-site meeting for the project consortium in Budapest in early December of 2024, where project management tasks were discussed, and a press event was held.

Moreover, MGFÜ prepared the Cooperation Agreement (D.1.1.2.), a written commitment of project and associated partners in implementing TASK4ISI project

and took part in the creation of analysis report (D.1.3.2.) discussing Hungarian best practices for female, young and people with disabilities programs.

In the upcoming period, the shared feedback will be incorporated into the development process of the learning materials to meet the expectations from target groups. Furthermore, in the upcoming ISIHUB meetings, the **prepared learning materials will be tested, peer reviewed and piloted** with the involvement of target groups.
